

Thinking About KFW's Mission

The mission of the Kentucky Foundation for Women is to promote positive social change by supporting varied feminist expression in the arts.

KFW carries out this mission through:

1. Two Grant Programs: Each year the foundation awards \$200,000 to feminist artists and arts & social change organizations in Kentucky through two grant programs: *Art Meets Activism* and *Artist Enrichment*. See *Thinking About Which Program Is Right For You* for more information.

2. Retreat and Residency Programs at Hopscotch House: KFW's Retreat Program offers artists, activists and allies who live and work in Kentucky day and overnight stays to create art, gain a deeper understanding of feminism, and strengthen their work for social change. The five-bedroom house, located on 10 acres of land in eastern Jefferson County, is available on a regular basis by request to individuals and groups that support KFW's mission. The Summer Residency Program offers 5 – 10 artists one or two week residencies at Hopscotch House in late June and/or early July. Is KFW's mission a good match for me?

This is the first question to ask yourself. The three major parts of the mission statement are "feminism," "social change" and "art." Please take a moment to think about how you would answer the following questions: What is feminist art? What does feminist art mean in Kentucky today? How does feminist art promote social change? What is positive social change? If you decide to apply for a KFW grant, the process of completing the application will challenge and inspire you to think through your own understanding and practice of feminism and social change, in your own context.

Which resources are right for me, at this time?

KFW is committed to supporting a wide range of feminist art for social change throughout the state. The KFW grant program is open to artists in all stages of their development, from beginning to highly experienced. KFW grants and resources are available to individuals, artist groups, and organizations who are committed to the creation of art that has the power to advance positive social change. Please carefully consider which of the following KFW resources would best support your artmaking, feminism and social change goals.

- For instance, if you are just learning about feminist art and social change, you could **sign up for the Hot Flash** to receive weekly information about opportunities in your region and throughout the state, connect with feminist social change artists and find out about workshops, programs, and retreats.
- Maybe you are an artist, feminist, or social change activist or ally who isn't ready to apply for or doesn't need a grant; however, you might benefit from a short or long term stay away from your daily life to create new work, deepen your understanding of feminism, or consider how your work can create positive social change. You could **request a retreat at Hopscotch House** for from one to five or six days. If you need more focused time to advance your art, you may want to **apply to participate in the Summer Residency Program**.
- If you are an artist who is experienced in one form but would like to explore new ways of making art, you might not have a work sample ready for the grant program. If so, you might consider **requesting a retreat at Hopscotch House** to develop your new art form. You could use your time there to create a work sample that "points in the direction" of where you want to go. Then you would have a sample ready to apply for a grant or to seek other forms of support for your new art work.
- Perhaps you are a feminist social change artist who is starting a new project, or perhaps there's a workshop that you think would move your artwork forward by leaps and bounds. You may want to **apply for an Artist Enrichment grant** to help fund your new work, or to support your participation in the workshop.
- Or, maybe you are a social change organization that wants to partner with an artist, or you want to use your artistic skills to engage community members in creating art for social change in some way. You may want to **apply for an Art Meets Activism grant** to support your community-based artmaking work-

As you can see, there are many ways to tap into KFW resources. There are also many ways to access support in your community for your artistic work and development, beyond applying for a KFW grant. KFW staff asks you to think through what you really need, so that you can best choose the path that makes most sense for you.
